### WORLD TEACHERS' DAY



Every year, World Teachers' Day reminds us of the critical role teachers play in achieving inclusive, quality education for all. Australia will celebrate and thank the teaching profession on **World Teachers' Day - Friday 30 October 2020**.

In 2020, World Teachers' Day will celebrate teachers with the theme *Teachers: Leading in crisis, reimagining the future*. The day provides the occasion to celebrate the teaching profession worldwide, take notice of achievements, and draw attention to the voices of teachers, who are at the heart of efforts to attain the global education target of leaving no one behind.

This year's World Teachers' Day has an even greater significance in light of the challenges that teachers have faced during COVID-19. As the pandemic has shown, they make a crucial contribution to ensuring continuity of learning and supporting the mental health and wellbeing of their students. ### **KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION**



The Kindergarten Transition Program assists with preparing your child for school and promoting a successful transition process. These transition practices, including orienting children and families to the school environment, experiences and routines remain an important priority for ensuring children have a strong and successful start to school.

The Transition sessions will begin next week in which the children will visit a Kindergarten classroom and participate in story time, counting and alphabet games, fine motor activities, language activities and developmental play. Quakers Hill Public School will also provide a virtual experience for parents and students to access the same face-to-face opportunities through our school website <a href="https://quakershil-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/">https://quakershil-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/</a> to offer your families a unique opportunity to see what our school is like and access information about Kindergarten. ### ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. The *Education Act 1990* requires parents/carers to ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school. Education is a sequential process and absences often mean students miss important stages in the development of topics, causing them to find 'catching up' difficult. All appointments should be scheduled outside of school hours where possible. This includes the end of the school day; students should not be picked up prior to the 3:15 pm bell.



### **STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAYS 2021**

Each year, Term 1 commences with a Staff Development Day and then the students usually resume school the following day. Then at the end of Term 4, students usually finish two days before the teachers, who return for two additional staff development days. The Department of Education has announced changes, to reverse this from 2021. Teachers will return to school on Wednesday 27 January 2021 and have two days of professional development in preparation for the school year. Students in Years 1 to 6 will return to school on Friday 29 January 2021. This additional staff development day will be in

#### 1. Download the Flexischools App

### 2. Add your School and Group

Click on the search icon, enter your school name, select your school and year group, or groups relevant to you.

#### 3. Login/Register

Click the 'Order now' button located in the bottom right-hand corner of the app, this will open a login screen.

- Already a Flexischools user Enter your details and login. To save your login details select 'remember me'.
- New Flexischools user Click 'Register', enter your email address and follow the instructions in the email to set up your account.
   Once your account is set up, add new student; search for our school, enter student details and select their class.

Once registered, you can start placing orders immediately. If you have any questions, please contact the Flexischools Customer Service Team on **1300 361 769**, or you can contact them via their website.

As part of our campaign against fare evasion, and our on-going commitment to provide the level of service needed to transport students to and from your school, Busways conducts regular checks of School Opal card.

All students must be in possession of a valid Opal card or pay a fare.

Students in possession of an Opal card must also tap on/off with their card when boarding our buses.

This is important, because the Opal data collected determines the level of service we are able to provide to your school. If students don't tap on and off, the services will appear under utilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.
